1 Corinthians 3:6-7 - St. Paul writes: I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who

waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth.

On Sunday, June 4, we'll be celebrating the 7th year of opening our Community Garden at St. Matthias with the "Blessing of Fields and Gardens". For those of you who aren't aware, we have a large, fenced in area behind the church building that we use as a "Community Garden". It's approximately 75 yards long and 25 yards wide.

Each year, the ground is tilled, the soil tested, and fertilizer added to prepare the soil for gardening. Those who sign up for a specific "garden plot" are then free to use their specific area to grow whatever vegetables, flowers, etc., they would like. Many of the seeds that are planted are donated to the Community Garden by our neighbors, and are free to be used by those tending their garden plots.

Of course, those who manage their garden plots are more than welcome to take home (or share with neighbors) the harvest that's produced. In addition, out of love for our neighbors in need, each week, we also take a portion of the harvest and donate it to the Westmoreland County Food Bank, so that it can be shared, without charge, to families who otherwise might not be able to afford produce.

Some of the produce is also placed on our "Harvest Table" inside our Fellowship Hall, which may be taken by anyone at no charge. We include a "free will" offering basket there for those who would like to make a monetary donation. All of those monetary proceeds are also sent to the Westmoreland County Food Bank. At the beginning and ending of each growing season, we also have a Bake Sale at St. Matthias, with all the monetary proceeds being donated to the Westmoreland County Food Bank as well.

It's amazing to note that in the 6 years of harvesting, we've donated 4,191 pounds of produce, and \$5,288 to the Westmoreland County Food Bank! And yet, we remember that it's God who has given us the gifts of soil, sun, rain, and seed. We simply prepare the soil, plant the seed, and collect the harvest. But God is the one who abundantly provides everything we need, and God Himself gives the growth. And as St. Paul reminds us, neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth.

That reminds us that God is always with us, to provide what we need. And God calls us to share what He has so generously and abundantly provided with our neighbors in need. Because with God, there's always more than enough for everyone. Thanks be to God!

Looking at the quarter's numbers, we are trending behind on our finances. Although expense have been reasonably close to the plan, receipts have been \$4,969 less. This is behind our 2022 receipt performance.

In 2022, the receipts at the end of March were \$37,006. In 2023, we ended the quarter at \$31,382. Any help to drive us closer to plan, in the form of lower expenses or higher receipts, would be greatly appreciated.
