Do you remember being a child, and having to wait for Christmas morning to open your presents? If you grew up before VCRs, DVDs, and

Netflix, you may remember having to wait to watch “The Wizard of Oz” on TV, because it was only shown one time per year! Waiting was so hard! Most of those things we waited for were worth the wait.

We’re not used to waiting much nowadays. If you have Amazon Prime, you can have something (almost anything!) delivered to your home within 2-3 days. With Netflix and other streaming services, you can watch almost any TV show or movie “on demand” whenever you like. If you have a question, you can use Google or Bing to instantly search for an answer (some of you may remember having to look things up at the library!). And dinner, which used to be prepared at home, is available within 2 minutes at a drive thru restaurant.

We’re not used to waiting much nowadays... we’re used to “instant gratification”. Unfortunately, that means we miss out on the benefits of waiting. Think of all the incredible blessings we have that often require us to wait. Waiting 9 months for a baby to be born. Waiting months at a time for our favorite season to arrive. Waiting to gather together with loved ones who don’t live nearby. Waiting for God to answer our prayer.

We’re so used to getting things instantly, we can sometimes forget how to wait. Advent is a time of waiting. A time of learning to allow God to respond in God’s own time, rather than instantly. Advent is a time to put less trust and emphasis on instant gratification, and more trust and emphasis on God, who always provides in ways that go far beyond what can be provided “instantly”. Following God often requires us to wait. But waiting for God also means that we’ll get what we really need, rather than

what we think we want. So we can ask ourselves, do we want something “right”, or “right away”? God invites us to wait in Advent... and the blessings God provides are always worth the wait. Thanks be to God!

Maxwell & Nicely Elementary Schools

Every year we request the names of 10 children from each school so we can shop for Christmas gifts from their wish list. They are identified by the schools because their families are having financial difficulties.

In the past we have suggested gifts be valued at least \$20. If a list is lengthy, it may be a good idea for several members to pull their resources. Tags will be on the Jesse tree in the narthex on **November 12th**. The gifts need to be at the church no later than **December 10th**. (Note: we are depending on the school for the lists, so the date the tags appear may be later.) There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Sign your name next to the tag identifier when you take a tag. Add your phone number in case we need to do a follow-up. When you bring the gift to the church, please attach the tag provided. Place the gift in an open gift bag. If the gift is in more than one bag, copy the identify information on to another tag. Be sure the tags are firmly attached. If you have any questions, please contact Bobbie Oestreicher.

Bethesda Lutheran Services

Also on the Jesse Tree you will find tags for Bethesda Children Services. We have been supplying \$20 Wal-mart gift cards for the children in the group homes. Our goal is 20 gift cards. These cards entitle the group home residents to purchase items they want under supervision of the agency’s staff. Bethesda, located in Meadville, PA, is one of our synod’s missions. They provide care to troubled youth in a loving, supportive environment. The tags will be put on the Jesse Tree for **November 12th** and the deadline for providing gift cards is **December 10th**.
